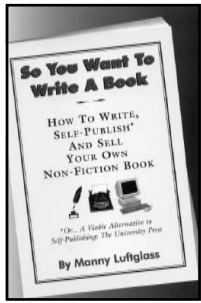
This book helps the researcher construct a name letter-by-letter backwards, using the legible

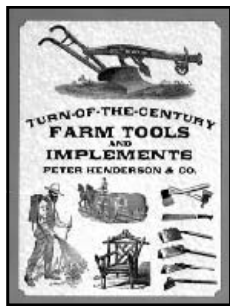

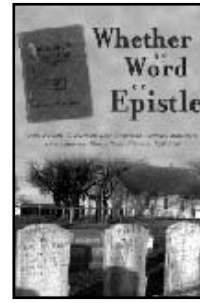


3218. Turn-of-the-Century Farm Tools and Implements—Peter Henderson & Co.
